Message from our CEO and Board Chair

We are pleased to report that FY 2022 was a year of regrowth and renewal for Girl Scouts of Northern Indiana-Michiana. We saw membership grow, added key staff positions, and formed new program and funding partnerships.

The annual Cookie Program started the year on a sweet note, as the new "Adventureful" variety became an instant hit!

In the summer we held Donor Appreciation Days at Camp McMillen, Camp Logan and Camp Soni Springs. Attendees took a golf cart tour, admired improvements, and a few even tried archery and the low ropes course! It was a wonderful chance to observe girls challenging themselves in outdoor activities, including riding the new trail bikes at Camp Logan.

Eight girls earned the Girl Scout Gold Award and were recognized at a special ceremony in June at Goshen College. One went on to receive the national Gold Award Scholarship.

Our annual STEM Expo in October at Purdue Fort Wayne attracted 100 girls who enjoyed fun, educational projects and learned about future careers in science, technology, engineering and math.

Finally, a highlight of 2022 was a \$15 million grant to Girl Scouts of the USA from the Lilly Endowment for the benefit of Indiana girls. The grant will be used to create a Hoosier Girl Coalition, with the goal of reaching more girls in underserved communities. We are committed to making the most of this incredible three-year opportunity.




