



## Ways Caregivers Can Help

### Do you have some extra time?

- Volunteer to come to a meeting to help with table decorations or posters.
- Work with your Girl Scout to complete her annual Cookie Entrepreneur Family Pin.
- Practice being a customer for your girl or with the entire troop.
- Create a template for younger girls to help them write thank-you cards.
- Coach girls on creating a pitch, song, or skit.
- Help your Girl Scout or the whole troop come up with unique wrapping or delivery ideas, such as using curly ribbon or gift bags.

### Do you have access to resources?

- Loan supplies for booth sales: card table, tablecloth, cash box, etc.
- Provide cans, bins, etc for Care to Share donations.
- Purchase aprons or money boxes to help management at booths.
- Print copies of booth tally sheets or other papers for the troop to use.
- Purchase or loan play money for practice sessions.
- Loan hats and mittens to girls who may forget to bring them to cookie booths.

### Everyone can help a little with these basics:

- Keep your receipts until your Girl Scout receives her rewards.
- Follow the rules set out by your troop cookie volunteer for cookie pickup and payments.
- Help your girl live the Girl Scout law by showing good sportsmanship towards everyone.
- Create realistic goals alongside your Girl Scout.
- Practice selling situations with your Girl Scout to help her confidence.
