S.W.A.P.S

- What does S.W.A.P.S stand for?
 Research S.W.A.P.S history. When were some of the first known
 S.W.A.P.S meets?
- Find some examples of S.W.A.P.S etiquette.
- Make your own unique S.W.A.P.S. Try to use recycled materials or things you already have at home! Bottle caps, paper clips, ribbon, pipe cleaners, stickers, or anything else you can think of!
- Research images of S.W.A.P.S. Show your three favorite to a friend or family member.
- Teach a younger sibling, Girl Scout, or friend about S.W.A.P.S.
- Exchange S.W.A.P.S with another Girl Scout. Remember to follow etiquette!
- Locate an upcoming S.W.A.P.S meeting near you.
- Recreate a SWAP you found online.
- Research different ways girls display their SWAPS. What's your favorite?

Songs

 New Friends" on YouTube by Melinda Caroll music
- Record yourself singing a Girl Scout Song. Post it if you'd like!
 Compile a song book of your favorite Girl Scout Songs.
- Teach a song to a younger sibling or girl/troop. Feel free to use virtual tools!
- Host a live sing-along—either online or in person.
- Learn a song in a different language. Try Spanish, Italian, French, or even American Sign Language!
- Sing this song with a female family member or friend:

 No girl is an island, no girl stands alone
 Each girl's joy is joy to me, each girl's dream is my own
