Please join us at 10 a.m. Wednesday, August 1, at Memorial Hospital, 615 N. Michigan St., South Bend, for a press conference to honor Girl Scout Gold Award recipient Margaret (Maggie) Sullivan of Granger. Park at the Lafayette Garage (Stork Level) and take the A elevator to the sixth floor. At the front desk, ask for Stephanie, the charge nurse, who will escort you to the NICU.

Maggie will describe her Gold Award project, which provided supplies for babies in the NICU. Maggie's project was inspired by her brother, Joe, who was born prematurely and spent time in the NICU. He is doing well now, but many families are not so lucky. Margaret created a way to make the bereavement process easier for families by organizing a cabinet and a cart in the unit with supplies. She also took the information that nurses use in the event of a death and condensed it into a binder and slideshow presentation, with the hope of creating efficiency for the staff and parents who lose a baby. Margaret volunteers at the hospital and plans to pursue a career in medicine.
