Haiku

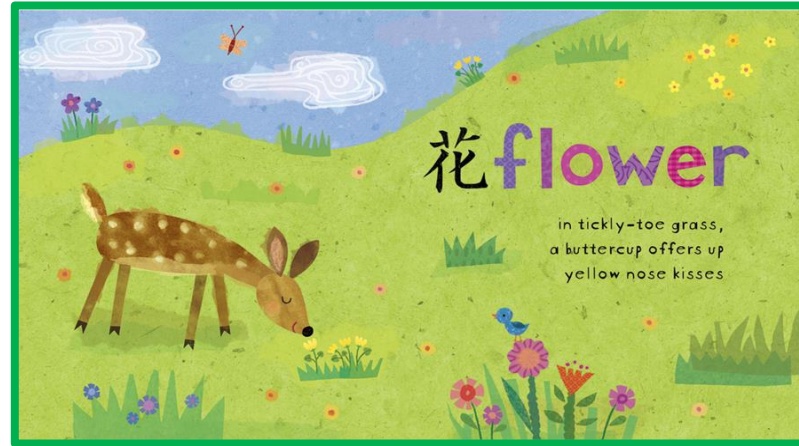
3 lines

Beaches

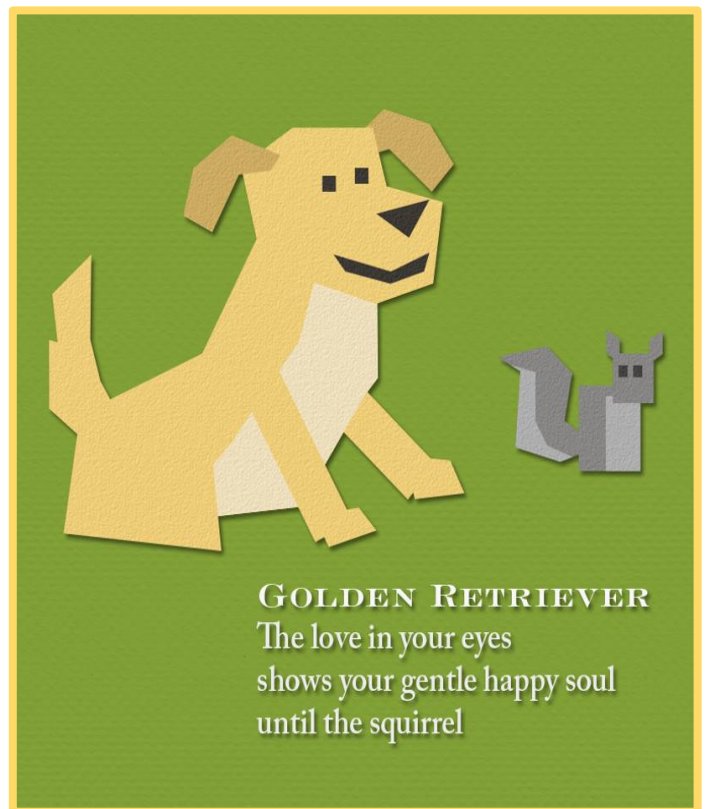

Blue water shimmers

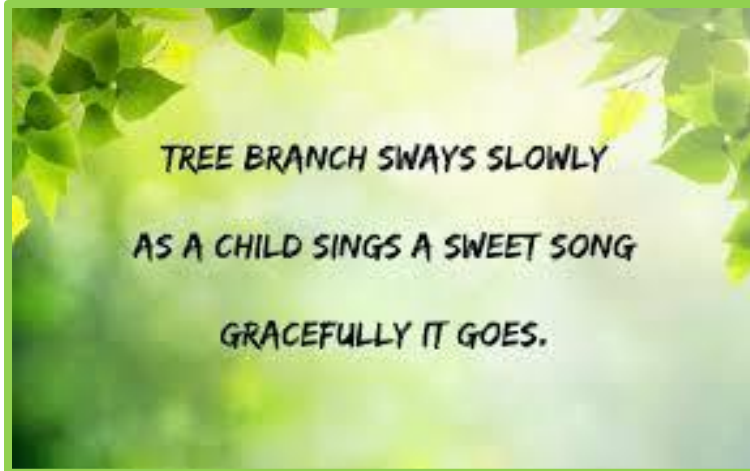


花flower

until the squirrel

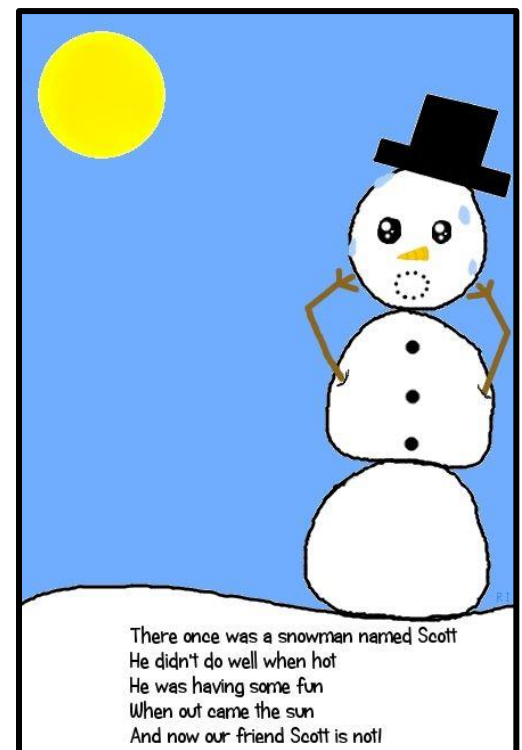


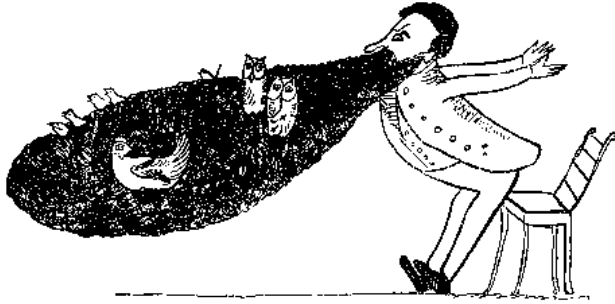
Limericks – short, rhyming, often funny
