How much do you know about the states that make up our council? Complete activities to learn about the state of Michigan.

Requirements:

- Daisy and Brownie- Complete FOUR Activities
- Junior- Complete SIX Activities
- Cadette, Senior, Ambassador- Complete ALL Activities.
- 1. Learn the State Tree, Flower, Bird, Song, Flag, Nickname, and State Holidays.
- Select one Native Michigan Artist, Author, Inventor, Politician, Actor, or Composer. Learn about them and their work and share what you have found with others.
- Make a map of Michigan. Locate on the map where you live and other points of interest your group knows about (Example: Council Camps, State Parks, Airports, etc.)
- 4. Learn about a few of the Michigan State Parks, where they are, how many are there, how they came about, and how they got their names.
- 5. Learn historical facts about Michigan, such as when Michigan became a state, important people who make Michigan history, things for which Michigan is most known, and how Michigan got its name.
- 6. Arrange for a storyteller or parent to tell stories at your troop/group meeting about real Michigan women, past and present.
- 7. Make a collage or mural about Michigan to share with others.
- 8. Plan an observance and celebrate an important day in Michigan History. Show a film or do skits to tell about this day.
- 9. Learn a song or game about Michigan that was written by a Michigan composer.
- 10. Select one Michigan County, trace it on a map, and find out as much as you can about it and share your information with your group.
