SWAPS made their first appearance at national Girl Scout Senior Roundups in the 1950s and 1960s. Historically, SWAPS are a way to provide contact information for girls to stay connected after larger events, a sort of Girl Scout business card.



- --SWAP without the final 's' means "Share with a Pal".
- --Traditionally, SWAPS are designed with something that can fasten, usually a safety pin.
- --SWAPS should tell something about the givers or their group.
- --Remember when making SWAPS, you will need multiple to trade.
